Student Drop-off Procedure Along Heatherstone and Grape

<u>Please consider walking or biking to school</u>. The school environment is a safer and healthier place when we reduce car traffic around the school. When driving students to school, be mindful of general traffic rules.

- All passengers in the car must wear seat belts or appropriate child restraints.

- The speed limit around the school is 25 miles per hour or less.
- No U-turns are allowed in the school zone.
- Follow the directions of the crossing guards at intersections and crosswalks.

Students MAY NOT be dropped off at school before 8:00 a.m. because there is no supervision available until that time.

Grape Ave. Drop-Off:

The Grape Drop-off is at the curb past the parking spaces as you head south on Grape.

- Reduce speed as you enter the drop-off lane designated by the cones.

- Proceed to the front of the line and wait for a volunteer to open the door.

- Make sure lunches, backpacks, and musical instruments are with your children. DO NOT get out of your car to retrieve items from the trunk.

- Once your child has safely exited the car (from the passenger's side of the car ONLY), the volunteer will close the door.

- Enter traffic cautiously and watch for bicyclists.

Heatherstone Drop-Off:

The Heatherstone Drop-off is in the circular drive on the south side of Heatherstone Ave.

- When entering the circular drive-thru in front of the school, form a single line of cars next to the sidewalk for drop-off.

- Do not double park to drop off your child, as it is very dangerous to allow children to walk between cars.

- Proceed to the front of the line and wait for a volunteer to open the door.

- Make sure lunches, backpacks, and musical instruments are with your children. DO NOT get out of your car to retrieve items from the trunk.

- Once your child has safely exited the car (from the passenger's side of the car ONLY), the volunteer will close the door.

- Do not park your car in the drop-off area, even for a few minutes, this backs up the drop-off line.

We may not have volunteers at these locations every morning, but the same general guidelines apply.

It is very simple to do, and only takes half an hour of your time (you can be on your way to the rest of your day by 8:20 AM). If you don't want to make a commitment for every week or even just once a month, you can volunteer for just one day only to see if you like it.
